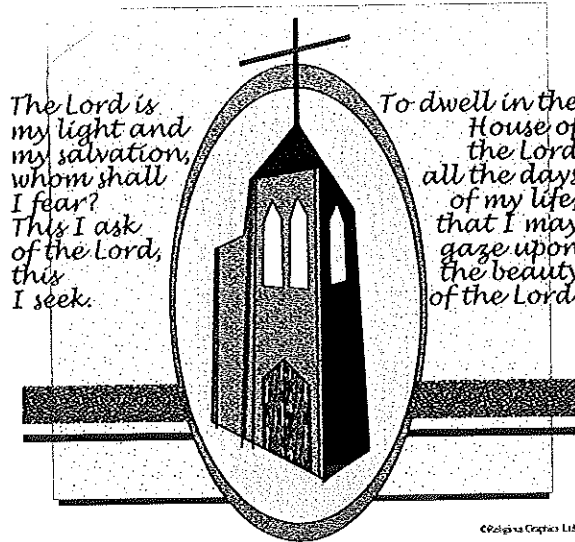

MARRIAGE MINUTE

This week's first reading and psalm speak of great rejoicing, of long-suffered sorrow being lifted. They are connected to the Gospel in which Jesus starts His public ministry. We often view joy as an emotion that comes upon us during favorable circumstances, such as winning the lottery. But this is not the way Jesus understood it. Joy is something we cultivate.

Jesus' first message for his first disciples is the first step to growing joy in our lives: repentance. If the idea of repentance doesn't come to mind when you think of joy, you're not alone. The connection is foreign to many of us, yet this is where the "peace on earth" that was promised us a few weeks ago at Christmas starts. Pray this week for the grace to see where you may have hurt your spouse (especially look at what you're not doing, but should) and then humbly ask forgiveness.
